Greetings from Auckland, New Zealand!

I am dictating this brief report only 15 minutes after arriving at our offices here in Auckland following about a 10-hour flying day yesterday from Honolulu, with a refueling stop in Western Samoa. It's a cloudy, rainy day, but the vivid greens and bright colors of New Zealand are striking nevertheless. This is, of course, my very first visit to New Zealand in my life, as it is for my wife and son David. We are to fly this evening to Christchurch on South Island to meet with a group who would have been driving over two-lane difficult roads from as far away as 200 miles or more for meetings from 7 to 9 p.m. Then tomorrow night at 8 p.m. in Wellington on North Island, and the following night here in Auckland, and then on to our offices at Burleigh Heads near Brisbane in Australia.

I was able to visit my father again briefly just barely before our departure, and he still appeared to be making very slow but steady progress. I hope you will all encourage your congregations to pray that God will intervene especially in helping him to overcome the current difficulty of his lack of red blood cells, and also the need for his own body to provide him with the energy and strength to gradually increase his walking and exercise so that he can continue to regain his strength. We were able to chat about essential things in the Work, including the recently announced personnel change in discontinuing our need for the services of Professor Osamu Gotoh, and of course the upcoming ministerial conference.

I was very relieved to be able to finish ten more five-minute programs, a column and one T.V. program the last two days prior to my departure. I am now completely ahead in half-hour radio, half-hour T.V., five-minute radio and columns so that I can turn my attention to the speaking, and hopefully creative writing, on this trip.

As I mentioned in my personal in the Worldwide News, I am absolutely elated over the tremendous response from the brethren to my letter offering them a free copy for each head of household of my new book, The Real Jesus. The letter has already broken all records for the percentage of return in the history of the Work!

DELUGED BY REQUESTS FOR THE REAL JESUS MPC is receiving a spectacular response to Mr. Ted Armstrong's special member letter offering his book, The Real Jesus. Through Friday, November 18th, the response was at 20,555-or 54.7%! This particular letter has received the largest response to any member or co-worker letter ever written by this Work for which records have been kept. The previous high was a GTA letter of 1974 which reached the 40% response level.

Mail for November is continuing to come in at a good rate. For the first 18 days 95,403 letters have been received, giving us a yearly total of 1,695,713 letters.

PT NEWSSTAND UPDATE The U.S. Newsstand Program is slated to distribute 495,000 copies of the January edition, and we plan to have a monthly turnover of nearly 800,000 by the end of this fiscal year. A recent Bulletin article announced that we had acquired approval to distribute the P.T. through 17 major airports across the United States. Unfortunately we have had to temporarily delay the opening of these airport outlets due to an overwhelming demand for additional magazines for rapidly expanding church distribution. However, we have been very encouraged by the overall response. So far, over 64,000 new subscribers have been added to the P.T. list as a result of newsstand efforts. In addition, recent findings have proven the current cost per response to be only about \$4.30.

WORLD NEWS UPDATE

Sadat's Visit to Jerusalem Electrifies the World Egyptian President Anwar Sadat's dramatic and courageous visit to Israel has put the Middle East back in headline number one position. The value of his bold journey to Jerusalem was mainly its tremendous psychological impact. Sadat's speech in the Knesset was predictably standard Arab policy regarding occupied territories, rights of Palestinians, etc., though his specific reference that old Arab Jerusalem should be a

"free and open city for all believers" was a bit of a sufprise. Begin responded with an emotional exposition of Israel's counterposition.

But again the impact on the senses was great. Seeing Sadat visit the shrine to the Jewish victims of the Holocaust and placing a wreath at the monument to the fallen Jewish soldiers of four Middle East Wars was startling. Equally so, the private interviews staged with American network news anchor persons—Begin and Sadat sitting side by side, referring to each other as friends, Sadat relaxed and smoking his pipe—such was unthinkable only two weeks ago. Where the Sadat visit exactly fits in we'll have to explore as the weeks go on. But it should be a lesson to us how dramatically sudden events can develop in the world.
