Recent Ordinations

Regional Director Dibar Apartian ordained two men as local elders during his recent trip to French Canada. Mr. Cyrille Richard, who serves the Montreal Church, and Mr. Yvon Brochu, who serves the Sherbrooke congregation, were ordained June 5. Then on Sabbath, June 2, Mr. Ross Flynn was raised to preaching elder. Hands were laid on Mr. Flynn by Mr. Vincent Panella, pastor of the Trenton and Vineland, New Jersey Churches.

International News

Spanish Area Update The first PURA VERDAD Bible lectures of 1984 were conducted April 29 and May 6 by Mr. Pablo Gonzalez in Mayaguez, the main city of the west coast of Puerto Rico. The 54 new people who attended, or 2.6% of those invited, represented the highest level of response for any lectures held in Puerto Rico.

Mr. Gonzalez reported that the attendees asked questions which indicated that they had thoroughly read much Church literature. One married couple who attended has already shown serious interest in the Church and is counseling with Mr. Gonzalez.

Mr. Mario Seiglie reports that on May 12, 350 new people attended the first of four PV Bible lectures scheduled for Santiago, Chile. Attendance for the second lecture held on Sunday, May 13 totaled 170, with 55 new people. The total of 405 new people represents a 7.5% response with two more lectures to go! Anti-government protests were scheduled for the day of the first lecture, but since very few people turned out, no measures were taken by authorities to ban public meetings. Previous protests had resulted in thousands of people on the streets and clashes between protesters and police.

Mr. Seiglie reported that on the first night he discussed the programs of the Church, Ambassador College, AICF, and Mr. Armstrong over the 50 years of this era of the Church, while in the second lecture he presented the topic "Ten Reasons Why Christ Must Return."

Further lectures are scheduled as follows: San Salvador, May 19-20; Guatemala City, May 26-27; and Bahia Blanca, Argentina, June 23, 24, 30, July 1. Lectures are also planned for two cities in Honduras in July, and other cities in Argentina and Uruguay near the Feast period. Lectures may also be conducted in seven or more cities in Mexico later in the year.

Circulation of the May PV was 210,937, setting a new record, exceeding the previous all-time level of the April PV by over 6,000. PV circulation is up 13% since the beginning of the year due to the implementation of Mr. Armstrong's new renewal policy, which extended the subscription term of over 31,000 subscribers. Since the beginning of 1984, a total of 35,776 new subscribers have been added to the files, 20.3% more than the year-to-date total of last year. Nine thousand three hundred fifty-six of these new subscribers have originated from Argentina, which now has the second-largest PV circulation.

Regional Director Leon Walker returned to Pasadena May 17 after a 26-day journey to Peru, Chile and Argentina to meet with our ministers in those countries. During this trip, festival sites in Huaraz, Peru and El Tabito, Chile were approved.

One night the respirator malfunctioned and the oxygen supply was cut off. The member could not breathe. He gasped for air to no avail. He prayed to God in the darkness of his room. No one had responded to his pushing the emergency button. Suddenly, he was aware of a man standing over him. The man did not turn on the light, nor did he speak, but as soon as he was by the bedside of our member the machine went on and began supplying oxygen. Once the machine started working again the man disappeared. Our member related this a few hours later to the hospital staff. They hadn't heard his emergency button call and there hadn't been a man on duty in the C.C.U. that night, therefore the staff told our member he just had a nightmare. The member knew better!

AMBASSADOR COLLEGE UPDATE

(Pasadena campus)

Since my last "A.C. Update," the faculties of both Big Sandy and Pasadena attended the fifth session of the Ministerial Refreshing Program. The Imperial Schools faculty and a few field ministers and their wives also attended this session.

We found the Ministerial Refreshing Program truly both inspiring and refreshing! It is always uplifting to be brought up to date on the major aspects of the work of God's worldwide Church, as well as being inspired by various doctrinal presentations.

Mr. Herbert W. Armstrong spoke to those attending the Refreshing Program on Friday, June 1. Mr. Armstrong recounted how, some years ago, Satan was in the process of trying to destroy God's College. He said that after his recovery from heart failure, God opened his eyes to see what was going on in the Work. He mentioned that before God restored him to put the Church and College back on track, "the Church was going backward. The Work was going down."

"Ambassador College was no longer God's College [in the mid-70s].... The Church was going liberal.... I had to start the College all over again," said Mr. Armstrong.

After admonishing the faculties of the College and Imperial Schools, Mr. Armstrong encouraged all of us to carry on faithfully in serving God. And, finally, after mentioning that the new "G-III" plane will be delivered on July 31, he reminded all of us that "physical things don't last!"

PUBLISHING SERVICES UPDATE

Newsstand Program Bears Fruit

The PLAIN TRUTH Newsstand Distribution Program is now in its eighth year in the United States, and we are beginning to see more and more results of its impact and success. As you are already aware, the prime purpose of the program is to promote The PLAIN TRUTH magazine which proclaims the Gospel as a witness to the world (Matt. 24:14); but we also know that "many are called but few are chosen." We are happy to report that the "few" who are being called and chosen by God are on the increase due in part to the newsstand program.

In 1982, 130 prospective members were baptized whose first contact with God's Church came through the newsstand program. In 1983, we saw an increase of 60% as 208 people who listed newsstands as the source of their first contact with God's Church became members. Because of the nature of the newsstand program, we have expected people to become involved more slowly.

The percentage of newsstand readers who become regular subscribers continues to rise. For 1984, response from the February newsstand issue was 2.3%; the response for March's issue so far is 2.5%; and the April issue's response is currently running at 2.8%. Responses from all three issues are still coming in.

This increase in response is extremely exciting and represents a considerable rise from the low of 1.2% last year. This continued rise in response is a direct result of the efforts of the coordinators in the field in obtaining new outlets. We have found the percentage of responses to be higher when new outlets are obtained and new people have exposure to the magazine for the first time.

In May, we received 346,864 requests for books and booklets. PT circulation programs accounted for 60% of these requests. The largest single source for people requesting literature continues to be the PT literature The insert envelope, with 54,466 people responding by using this vehicle. largest sources for book and booklet requests are listed below.

UPDATE FROM MAIL PROCESSING

WATS Operation Maximizes Service to Callers

One of the major goals in Telephone Response is to see that every caller responding to "The WORLD TOMORROW" telecast gets through quickly and efficiently. Therefore several improvements were made recently to help us cope with the heavy increases in telecast responses. These innovations allow more people to reach us immediately following the program, thus increasing the number of people we serve.

One improvement involves the greeting we use when people call after a telecast. We now answer, "The WORLD TOMORROW program, would you like the literature offered today?" This new salutation saves about 10-12 seconds per call, which is enough to allow several more calls to be answered in those first few minutes.

Another improvement involves the use of tape machines on "overflow" lines. When all of our operators are busy, the caller receives a taped message which gives him the option of leaving his request or calling back ten minutes later. Within this time frame, call volume has usually dropped substantially so that callers can get right through.

ON THE WORLD SCENE

LONDON ECONOMIC SUMMIT: PROBLEMS POSTPONED

Dateline: Paris, France

The London Economic Summit is past history. The leaders of the Free World's seven democratic industrial powers--the United States, Japan, West Germany, France, Italy, Britain and Canada--have returned home, some to hot, political challenges. Departed too, are the about 3,500 accredited reporters, including this writer.

What was accomplished at this 10th annual summit? Little of prime importance. But then in some ways, that was to be expected. Shortly before the conference was to begin, Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher of Great Britain, host of this year's meeting, cautioned reporters not to expect too much from the three-day affair. That way, she said, they would not be disappointed.

After the conference was over, a senior U.S. diplomatic official commented: "The final result was nonspectacular, which is the way summits are supposed to work. What counted at the London Summit was not the agreements or lack thereof, but the process." The "process," in fact, does have some importance in itself. Mrs. Thatcher also stressed that if these annual meetings had not taken place during the tumultuous years since 1975, the world economy could likely be in much worse shape. Without these summits, she implied, trade wars could have already become a grim reality.

It is pretty hard to start wars, trade or otherwise, when leaders, as long as they are basically reasonable people in the first place (no Khomeinis or Kadafis), have the opportunity on a regular basis to speak to each other behind closed doors and face to face.

Political Concerns

Nonetheless one had the feeling that nearly all of the leaders were only "half there" in London. Nearly all of them were, in effect looking over

their shoulders at political events in their home countries. What they committed themselves to, or refused to commit themselves to, was basically influenced not by the larger good of the world economy, but what was considered acceptable to their own voting publics.

All of U.S. President Ronald Reagan's counterparts were known to be concerned about the continuation of high deficits and high interest rates in the U.S. economy which, they claimed, puts a drag on the world economy. For his part Mr. Reagan was eager to avoid specific references to these points. It is significant that when the summit's final communique on the world economy was produced, uncomfortable direct references to the U.S. deficit, present in the initial drafts of the paper, were deleted. The widespread feeling is that no other Western leader wanted to harm Mr. Reagan's reelection chances. Despite any criticisms they had of Mr. Reagan, it appears they would rather deal with him than anyone the Democratic Party would select.

World Indebtedness

The seven leaders (plus the president of the commission of the European Community) tiptoed around two of the world's most serious crises. First of all, the war raging between Iran and Iraq in the Persian Gulf, and second, the burgeoning indebtedness of Third World countries. The leaders were clearly playing for time. Because there are huge oil stocks in the major Western countries, the leaders were able to get away with only a weak call upon Iran and Iraq to "cease the attacks on each other and the shipping of other states." The urgency to do more was clearly missing.

Regarding the multibillion dollar indebtedness of Argentina, Mexico, Brazil and a host of other nations, the summit leaders merely proposed to encourage commercial banks and governments to renegotiate loans, changing them from the present year-by-year review to multiple-year rescheduling. If the summit proposal is adopted by the world's big lending institutions, the net effect will be to once again buy more time before major defaults in the world's interlocking economic structure occur. There are indications that major banks are being arm-twisted to go along with the proposal.

Reagan-Thatcher Relationship

This summit, as in previous meetings, provided the opportunity for the assembled leaders to engage in what are called "bilateral" meetings--separate meetings between two individuals.

Certainly a very important bilateral meeting was the one between Mr. Reagan and Mrs. Thatcher. They met privately three days before the summit began. Their conference lasted almost an hour longer than scheduled. A Presidential aide who sat in on the meeting said it was the most stimulating high-level private talk he had heard in 15 years. The real reason why this close harmony exists was partially provided by Mr. Reagan the day he left London after the summit was over. In his departing speech the President referred warmly to Americans and Britons as kindred peoples--which the Church of course knows they are.

The June 8 issue of the FINANCIAL TIMES of London contained some interesting thoughts about what it said was the "cozy relationship" between Mr. Reagan and Mrs. Thatcher. Why is it that President Reagan and Mrs. Thatcher, together again in London for the Economic Summit meeting, seem to have so much in common that neither would be equally at home with, say, President [Francois] Mitterrand of France?...

Mrs. Thatcher must be one of the most remarkable British politicians of the postwar period. She wins elections. She is a woman prime minister of what is still predominantly a male role. Far from her running out of puff, she still stands head and shoulders above her ministerial colleagues, perhaps more so than ever....

It is the same with President Reagan...it must be a fiction that he is totally incompetent. No one can govern California, which has a larger population and a greater domestic product than some European countries put together, without having some interest in power. To go on to become president, and then to seek reelection with every chance of winning, must at least indicate considerable ambition and self-confidence.

Most Important Bilateral Meeting

There was one more "bilateral" that took place during the conference-actually two--of even greater significance. In the late afternoon of the second day of the summit, June 8, Pastor General Herbert W. Armstrong met the two top Japanese leaders back to back. To me this is astounding, as both Prime Minister Yasuhiro Nakasone and Foreign Minister Shintaro Abe (who is a likely future prime minister) were extremely busy with the summit proceedings. Nevertheless they made time available to Mr. Armstrong.

The Japanese leadership is eager to continue and, in fact, expand their relationship with Mr. Armstrong and the Ambassador Foundation in jointly funding worthwhile projects in Third World countries. An example of this is the cooperation between the two with regard to the funding and construction of the Jomo Kenyatta College of Agriculture and Technology in Kenya.

The Japanese leaders trust Mr. Armstrong to take the lead in such efforts by planting the initial seed. Once they are convinced that they want to participate, they then follow up with multiple times over the initial investment. This comes from the treasury of the world's second-largest economic power. Such projects not only give prestige to God's work, they open still more doors for Mr. Armstrong to walk through.

Seeing firsthand the honor and respect that these powerful leaders have for the apostle of God's Church in this end-time age was personally far more thrilling to me than being associated with the activities at the summit itself.

This world's political activities, summits and all, are nearing their ultimate end. But the activities of God's Church in this age will help usher in the wonderful World Tomorrow.
